# Day 50—Thursday, April 19, 2012

I can honestly say that today was probably the most frustrating day for me so far as a student teacher. As much as I love these kids and having the opportunity to teach them it can be a real struggle at times to capture their attention and maintain their respect. Today the boys had a substitute teacher so most of the students felt like they could just act out showing no respect. I think I had to say something to 5 out of my 7 classes today. I even had to go out of my comfort zone those five classes and raise my voice. In my seventh period class just as we were going in at the end of the period to change one of the boys pushed another boy and said a few unkind words. So I addressed him about the issue after hearing the one boy's point-of-view. I just wanted to solve this issue in a common mature manner, so I asked him what happened instead of telling him what the

other boy had said (this way I could hear his side of the story too without jumping to conclusions). He then got very defensive and started yelling and walking away. I told him I just wanted to talk to him about the situation but he made a huge scene in front of the class and became very defensive with his words. So I did not think it would be appropriate or fair to the other students to just let it go. So I sent him to the principal's office and then immediately called down to make sure they knew he was coming. Then after the bell rang I went down to the office to clarify what happened and to let Mr. VanCleave know that I was sorry for turning this issue into his problem. We talked for a while and he helped me understand why this student acts out the way he does and I told him I understand and that my goal is to try and connect with the student in a positive way; however, I also needed to let him know that even as a student teacher I do hold him to the same level of expectations as his regular classroom teacher does. Mr. VanCleave said that he felt like I handled this situation in a positive way and he appreciated that I followed up on it rather than just leaving it all on him. My goal tomorrow is to pull this student aside and explain to him my expectations and to also reassure him that I am not just calling him out to pick on him but to help him get his actions in line. Today was a great learning and growing day for me and I know that as a teacher I will have days like this; but knowing the reasons why I am here and remembering why I do what I do will inspire me to find strength in these moments and provide me with the motivation and desire I need to overcome each struggle.
