Explanation: This activity is done in groups of three: Doer, observer, and retriever. This activity is designed to obtain peer feedback and learn through group work. Tasks are explained below.

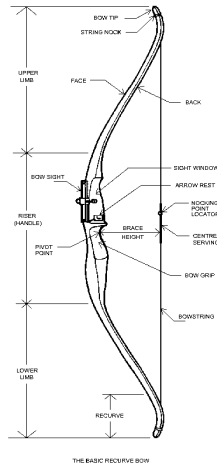
Doer: Shoot an end of arrows (6), using proper form and observing all safety precautions which have been addressed in class.

Observer: Examine the doer's shooting form and evaluate performance, based on the main points below. Make a checkmark on either the "Can Do" column, or the "Needs Practice" column. Address the doer afterward, explaining your findings and making corrective suggestions.

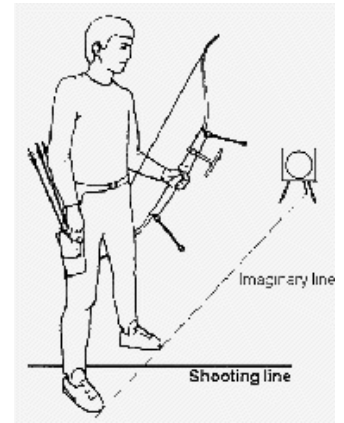
Retriever: After everyone on the shooting line has shot their end of arrows and set down their bows, retrieve the arrows for your group and place them back in the quiver. **Everyone rotate tasks after the arrows are retrieved and the feedback has been given.**

Criteria for Correct Shooting Form:

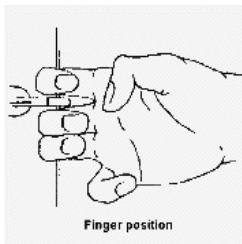

1. Bow has been brace using the Step Through method, with string placed in correct position and bow bent in the right direction.	_____	_____
2. Feet straddle the shooting line and are parallel with it.	_____	_____
3. Arrow is nocked with odd-colored feather facing away from bow, with 1 finger above and 2 below the nock.	_____	_____
4. String is anchored to the chin/lips/nose, OR cheek.	_____	_____
5. Bow arm is fully extended, and opposite elbow is parallel with the ground.	_____	_____



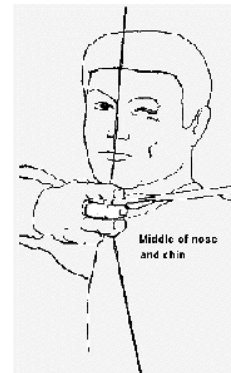

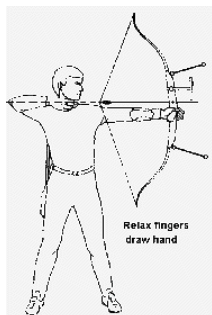
