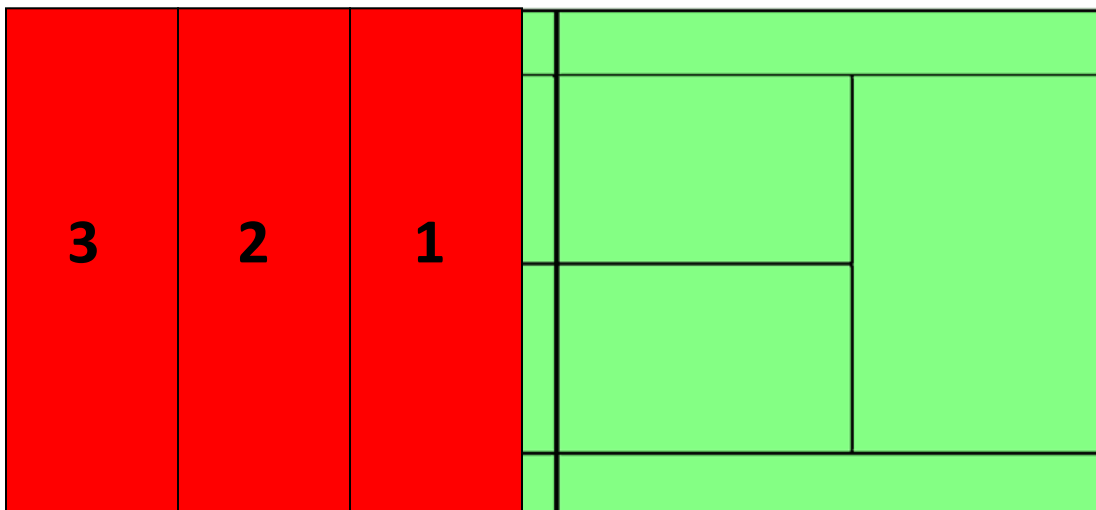


Tennis Skill Test

Test #1:

For the forehand drive the student will stand in the receiving position at the center mark of the baseline. The teacher will be on the other side of the net hitting balls to the student being tested. The student will return the ball over using the forehand drive for 10 balls. Each returned ball is scored from 0 to 3 points depending on where the return lands. The ball must over the net and in singles play or it will be scored a zero. Balls that land on the line earn the higher value. A perfect score is 30.

Test #2:

For our forehand drive skill test we will construct a test for accuracy. The wall will be taped off into several sections, each worth a certain amount of points. The student will hit 10 balls at the wall, with a possible perfect score of 50 points. The student will be 15 ft away from the wall when he/she hits the ball towards the wall. The object of the test is for the student to hit the ball into the wall, aiming for the highest point value.
