The exam will probably consist of four essays, chosen from some slightly larger set of questions. You will be allowed to consult the relevant primary texts while writing your essays.

- 1. Compare and contrast **Platonism**, **Aristotelianism**, and **Neo-Platonism** i.e., how are they similar and how are they different?
- 2. What is time, according to Augustine?
- 3. How do Augustine and Aquinas understand creation and God's relation to creation?
- 4. Describe the **movement of Greek thought** to the Christian West, and the points of agreement and conflict that Christianity found with Plato, Aristotle, and Neo-Platonism.
- 5. What is the **problem of universals**, and why was it important? Be able to describe the problem and the possible solutions.
- 6. Be able to discuss the relationship between **faith and reason**, as understood by as many of the following as possible: Augustine, Averroes (Ibn-Rushd), Maimonides, Aquinas, and Ockham.
- 7. What is **negative theology**? What arguments support this?
- 8. Discuss the concepts of knowledge, personal survival, and the Agent Intellect for Avicenna (Ibn-Sina).
- 9. How does Aquinas argue against "those who say that the existence of God, being self-evident cannot be demonstrated"?
- 10. Be able to describe and critique Aquinas attempt to prove **God's existence**.
- 11. Why does **Ockham** emphasize divine omnipotence, and what does this omnipotence imply?
- 12. Discuss **Meister Eckhart's** understanding of the relationship between God and humans.
- 13. What is **Pico** della Mirandola's understanding of the place and status of human beings?
