Man: The root hairs absorb large amounts of water and minerals from the Earth. This water travels through the roots, through the trunk, and through the branches to the leaves. The leaves use it in making food for the tree. The minerals are used by the cells in other parts of the tree for new growth. The bark is the outer protective covering of the tree. Under the bark is the cambium from which new wood and bark grow.
