- The transformation of schooling to include the needs and perspectives of many cultures in shaping the ways that children are educated.
- Multicultural education is about social change and awareness.

Statistics

- In 2020 it is estimated that 46% of students in Americas will be children from a minority group. And 20.1% of all students will live in poverty.
- The top 25 largest school districts, minority students comprised about 72% of the total school enrollment in the year 1994.
- Only eight states in America can say that their minority student scores increased on state testing.
- 248,000 students were surveyed in grades 6 through 12.
 - 84% indicated most teenagers carry some racial prejudice.
 - 45% said that they had personally experienced prejudice in the past year.

Stereotyping effects the classroom

- Stereotype- a simplified and standardized conception or image invested with special meaning an held in common by members of a group.
 - Example: Minority students are not as intelligent as the majority group in schools.



Bilingual Education


- Design to meet the learning needs of students whose first language is not English.
- Bicultural -able to function effectively in two or more linguistic and cultural groups.
- Bilingual Education Act
- Equal Education Opportunity Act
- Debates surrounding bilingual programs

Guidelines for multicultural instructional materials

- Should accurately portray the perspectives, attitudes, and feelings of ethnic groups
- Strong ethnic characters
- Identifiable
- Universal conflicts
- Appropriate illustrations
- No racist concepts, clichés, phrases or words
- Historically accurate
- Major events and documents related to ethnic history

Creating a Curriculum

- Contrary to popular belief, including culture in holidays is not enough. It requires critical thinking, research, and the inclusion of various perspectives.
- Content Integration- The inclusion of materials, concepts and values from a variety of cultures.
- Integrating culture into basic subjects
 - For example: Ethnomathematics
 - Combining mathematical thinking with culture
