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Intro to teaching

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It is amazing what a classroom full of students can make one think. After my experience this fall I cannot wait to get into the education program. I had many great experiences at the schools I observed. The opportunity to observe teachers and students in real classes greatly increased my teaching knowledge.

My observations started at the Manchester Jr. High. I thought this was a great first place to start my observations. While watching a co-ed gym class, I was impressed with the student's ability to get along with each other and play games fairly. I never wanted to teach the middle school age but this observation made me think about teaching other grades. Previously, I had imagined myself teaching younger kids; I thought that middle school students were immature and it would be difficult to control the classroom. During my second observation I went to Manchester High School. The high school was an experience I will never forget. The junior class subject was civil war and slavery. I want to teach kids the tools to do well in high school and to succeed by using various interactive teaching methods in school. The following week my group traveled to the Manchester Elementary School. I had the time of my life. I had a great first year teacher who told me about all of her struggles with teaching. She told me about the new teaching methods she was testing out and how they were working for her. The teacher let me help a young girl with her math. She was struggling, and I helped her by telling her some basic rules in math so she can remember numbers. I felt amazing helping this little girl; I was making an impact on this student's education by developing a skill she would use later in life.
